

MIDWEST INTERCLUB HIGH POINT AMATEUR STAKES TROPHY

This trophy will be designed and made by the company in Chicago that does the Oscars.

The trophy would be an Antiques Silver Cup which is hand spun from solid brass and electroplated silver. The trophy itself would be on a round black base with a dog top carrying a bird. A custom base would be made that would be a matching black finish to compliment the black finish of the above round base and have custom cut silver plates – 6 plates per side for a total of 24 individual plates. The bottom block would be an 8 3/8" sq x 6 5/8" sq block x 5 1/4" height. An additional base could be attached to this base if so decided later. A box will be made for transporting the trophy.

The trophy will be awarded to the dog with the highest points accumulated in the Amateur Stakes in the Midwest Interclub area only. The points will be calculated from the placements of each Midwest Interclub Field Trial held from National to National as directed at each year's Amateur National Delegate's meeting. It shall be given out along with the Midwest Interclub Amateur Stakes Pro Plan award.

The trophy shall be presented to the dog's owner/handler and kept until the next Amateur National. It shall then be returned to the Amateur National Secretary prior to the start of the Amateur National award presentation day.

It is the responsibility of the winner of the trophy to have their dog's name, owner, and handler with the year engraved on the plate prior to its return.

It is the responsibility of the winner of the trophy to deliver or send the trophy to the National Secretary or make arrangements to deliver the trophy prior to the start of the Amateur National. The National Committee can email, write, or call prior to the National as a reminder to return the trophy in time for the National's.

The Northeast Wisconsin Spaniel Club will be responsible for the upgrade or repair of the trophy as necessary.

The trophy will be retired to the Bird Dog Hall of Fame after the trophy is full, if they will accept it. If not, the Club will take the trophy back and store it.
